## Nature Walks

The Fumee Lake Commission invites the public to participate in their guided Spring Walks at the Fumee Lake Natural Area. These walks are for wildflower enthusiasts, bird watchers and nature lovers of all ages and abilities.

**Bird Watching walk: Sat May 16, 7am**

**Wild Flower walk: Sat May 30, 8am**

A variety of birds live, breed or migrate through the Natural Area. Warblers, Loons, and Bald Eagles are just a few of the species you may encounter on the Bird Watching Walk.

The Nature Walk will feature many of the wildflowers that can be found at Fumee, including several native orchids. Your guide will also discuss the areas wildlife and explain the history of Fumee.

Meet at the East parking lot off the Upper Pine Creek Rd (off US2 between Quinnesec and Norway). Participants should dress for the weather and wear comfortable walking shoes. Birdwatchers should bring binoculars and a bird guide. A Wildflower guide is suggested for the Nature walk. Photographers are encouraged to bring their cameras.

These guided walks are at a slow pace on easy terrain. Walking distance is just over 1 mile and will last 2-3hrs. There is no charge to participate and a County park sticker is not required.
